Beloved in Christ,


Let me tell you the story of “Dr. Pierre” and All Saints’ Church:

Once upon a time, there was a seminary graduate from Tennessee looking for a church “in the northern part of the Diocese where English was taught”. Unlike Goldilocks looking for a comfortable chair out of three chairs, the seminary graduate was looking for a comfortable worship place out of six churches. Dutifully, the seminary graduate went from one church to another. One was “too far”; one was “too small”. Still, another was “too big”. Finally, the seminary graduate found “just the right size”. But what determined the “right size” had nothing to do with the dimensions of the church buildings, but, rather, the response directed to the seminary graduate.

Specifically, “Dr. Pierre” entered All Saints’ campus for the first time ten minutes before a Vestry meeting. He was greeted warmly by members of the Vestry. He was asked to say a prayer immediately before the meeting was called to order. He was bidden farewell with love. Walking to the automobile, Dr. Pierre thought to himself, “I have found a home, a temporary home, but nonetheless, a home”.

Church studies, revealed through the work of our diocesan Nehemiah Process, have revealed that the way the Episcopal Church, and specifically All Saints’ Church, Jensen Beach, operates today is not conducive to the population of the early 21<sup>st</sup> century. Our buildings are too small and too structured, our prayer books do not encourage participation, and religion is not seen as relevant to today’s culture. I agree with much of this observation.

AND YET, All Saints’ continues to grow, modestly, but we grow. I believe it is because of the encounter experienced by our seminary graduate, who, God willing, will be with us for several months to come. Your attention, your support and indeed your love to those who enter this resort area are to be commended. I know you do not offer your hand of hospitality for the purpose of convincing folk to join the All Saints’ community. Your welcome is based on your sincere wish to greet people in the name of the Lord. For that, I thank God and I thank you.

## Peering Into the Past

44 years ago we were making another new beginning.

“Rev. Willard Lynn Instituted As New Rector of All Saints’ –

Rev. Willard Lynn was instituted as rector of All Saints’ Episcopal Church, Jensen Beach.

The institution was performed by the Rt. Rev. Wallace E. Conkling, retired bishop, Diocese of Chicago.

The Institution of a rector in the Episcopal Church is a formal and symbolic service, consisting of two parts. First, the vestry, as representatives of the congregation, gives the keys of the church to the new rector. Then there is a formal reading of the Letter of Institution from the bishop of the diocese, in this case, Bishop Henry I. Louttit, confirming the new rector’s authority over the spiritual care of the people in the parish.

Asked whether he liked it in Jensen Beach, Rev. Lynn replied, “very much,” adding that it, was quite a welcome change from the big suburban parish of Orlando where he was previously.”<sup>[1]</sup>

The service was at 4 p.m. when the Rev. Willard Lynn became our 3rd Rector. At the bottom of the service sheet that remains on file is the following note which read: “Your offerings at this service by the gracious courtesy of Bishop Louttit will be for the marble bench for the churchyard garden. Our guests are invited to remain after service for a reception on the patio for our new Rector.”

So where is the Patio you ask? Well it is under the nursery and the current foyer. In 1963, when the original church was moved, there was a patio that went from the edge of the cemetery along the eastern edge of the parish hall. This was shady late in the summer afternoon and of course there is always the ocean breeze.

Father and Mrs. Lynn had two elementary age children - Julie and Rusty.

## THE ORDER OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE KING

The Daughters of the King is a religious order for laywomen founded in 1885 with approximately twenty-five thousand members worldwide. We each take a life long vow to prayer, service and evangelism when we become members. Membership is open to any interested woman who is in good standing within the Church and is willing to complete a four to six month course of study of the Daughters materials.

We are told in our Handbook that "our faith is not to be a private faith hidden in our hearts. Our faith is to be lovingly and joyously proclaimed so that Jesus Christ, lifted up in our lives and our words, might draw all to Him, that all might experience His love and saving grace."

Here at All Saints', the Chapter presently has 22 active members and each one of us has our various fields of service both in the church and in the community. We do NOT raise funds for the DOK nor do we 'sponsor' specific outings or activities; we are a varied group of women each serving Christ in His church as we feel called. Every member pays her own annual dues, so the DOK is NOT a budgeted item for the Parish.

The one thing we do have in common is PRAYER. Our call to intercessory prayer is taken seriously, and to this purpose we lift others in loving, healing prayer before our Lord daily. We also pray daily for the continued spiritual growth of our Priest and Church members. Through our prayer chain and prayer list, we hope you will request prayer if or when you are in need. All prayer requests are kept in confidentiality.

This year we went in June because I will be returning to the Diocesan School for classes in the Fall which I do look forward to.
