The Feast of St. Nicholas, 2010

Beloved in Christ,

As the Vestry and I entered fully into the first decade of the 21st century, we reported to you that there were at least three areas of ministry at All Saints' which needed greater attention than other areas. They were 1) acquiring full parish status 2) finding an organist-choir director to develop a choir and 3) strengthen ministry to young people within All Saints'. We are now about to enter the second decade of this century and we are able to report success in our first priority, as I celebrated, with you, last month, my first year anniversary as the Seventh Rector of All Saints' Church. Melanie and David have provided accomplishments in our second goal, offering Almighty God a joyful sound! The other day I climbed up to the choir loft and was amazed to see EVERY SEAT filled in the loft!

The third goal is just as important as our first and second goals, but it has proven to be the most elusive of the three. Arlene Bruttell has made SIGNICANT contributions toward the Christian Education of our young people, by introducing us to Godly Play. The days of having only one acolyte are over, as we now host as many as ten young men and women serving in the sanctuary. We recently completed in the Summer of '10 a God and Country program with the Boy Scouts. Still, we are a distance from hosting an Episcopal Youth Community which can compliment the study and work of the Church. We need to provide a setting for our young people which involves missionary and social events.

It is not that the Vestry and others have not made noble efforts in accomplishing the goal of establishing a vital youth ministry at All Saints. Financial resources have been offered and individuals have volunteered, but these efforts have "not taken hold". Part of it is due to the ever-mobile society in which we live and the small percentage of young people attending All Saints' Church.

On this month's cover of The Trumpet, there is a photograph of efforts being made toward the work of establishing an Episcopal Youth Community at All Saints' Church. The planning is in place. Please keep all who are involved in this effort in your prayers.

The story of our efforts directed to our Youth reminds us that we have to stay ever vigilant in serving God in all areas of ministry. Supporting the mission of our parish, holding up in prayer those who lead us in singing, and enabling our young people to be the best they can be are all efforts which need attention each and every day.

STRESS MANAGEMENT

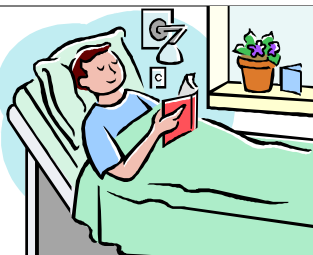

Peering into the Past

The First Baptisms at All Saints Church

On January 9th, we remember the Baptism of our Lord on the Episcopal Church Calendar. This brought me to thinking about the 1st Baptisms at All Saints'. What were they like? Who were they? The Rt. Rev. William Crane Gray, Bishop of the Missionary Diocese of Southern Florida recorded in his diary,

"First Sunday in Lent, February 19th, (1899) – Arrived at Jensen and was joined by the Reverend B. F. Brown, Archdeacon. A new Church has been built about halfway between Jensen and Waveland, which I consecrated as All Saints' Church, this day. Messrs. Racy and Male received the Archdeacon and myself at the front door, handed me the keys, and we proceeded with a really fine and satisfactory service. Some children were baptized. I preached the consecration sermon and celebrated the Holy Communion. At 7:30 p.m. held evening services in the beautiful new St. Paul's Church, Eden."[\[1\]](#)

The Prayer Book of **1892**, the second for the Episcopal Church, was the liturgy used. Mildred Grace and Gladys Edith Willes are recorded as the 'the children' baptized that February 19, 1899 with the Officiating Minister Archdeacon B. F. Brown.[\[2\]](#) Glimpses of these two Jensen girls are provided in their obituaries.

"Mildred G. Willes -- Mildred G. Willes, 73, of 315 S.W. Sixth Court, Boynton Beach, died Tuesday in the Bethesda Memorial Hospital in Boynton Beach.

A former resident of Jensen Beach, Miss Willes was a member of the All Saints' Episcopal Church of Jensen Beach and a member of the Homemakers Club of Miami.

Survivors include two sisters, Helen M. Stevenson of Fort Pierce and Angeline G. McCandless of West Palm Beach; three brothers, Errol S. of Fort Pierce, Frederick H. of Lake City, and Herbert C. of Boynton Beach.

Funeral services were held from the Scobee-Combs Funeral Home in Boynton Beach at 10 a.m. Friday. Graveside services were held at 2 p.m. from the All Saints Cemetery at Jensen Beach, with Fort Pierce Funeral Home in charge."[\[3\]](#)

Her headstone reads - Mildred G. Willes, 12-May-1900 -17-Jul-1973

Though the Rev. Frank R. Alvarez isn't listed as having been the officiating clergy at her graveside service, he was the Rector at the time.

"Gladys E. Cope -- Mrs. Gladys Edith Cope, widow of the late Oliver Cope of 1101 Georgia Ave. West Palm Beach, died Wednesday in the Good Samaritan Hospital of that city. Born in Jensen Beach, July 27 1898, she had lived there until 1958.

Surviving are a son, Laurence L. Cope of Washington, D.C.; three sisters and four brothers including Errol W. Willes of Fort Pierce.

Funeral Services will be held at All Saints' Episcopal Church, Jensen Beach, at 11 a.m. Friday, with the Rev. Frank L. Alvarez officiating. Burial will follow in All Saints' Cemetery. The Mizell-Faille- Zern Funeral Home of West Palm Beach is in charge of arrangements."[\[4\]](#)

No grave site marker is found on the plot location recorded in cemetery records for her but next to her 'probable' site is found a headstone marked "Oliver F Cope - Connecticut - PFC Medical Department - World War I – August 6,1895 – September 11, 1960".

Second of a 6 part series called: From the Lectern

As a fairly "newly-minted" Episcopalian, in 1970, I was asked by Fr. John A. Hart at Church of the Redeemer, Southfield, Michigan to assist at the Altar as a Lay Reader. The duties were the same as those of a Lay Eucharistic Minister, today. At that time, intinction was not common practice. We also had only one female Lay Reader. I discovered that I received much more than I gave by reading the Word to the best of my ability and by dispensing "The Blood of Christ". After the Service I would have a profound feeling of discovery - the best way I can describe it.

When I joined All Saints, in 1996, I felt very comfortable - as though I was "home". However, something was missing but I did nothing about it. Iris mentioned in conversation with Courtney Ryan one day that I had been a Lay Reader in Michigan. The next week, Fr. Tom Ryan invited me to become a member of the All Saints' Lay Reader Corps. After some training in the nuances of our Diocesan traditions, I was able to take my place at the Altar.

On the days that I fulfill my duties, I again get that warmth inside that I have, in a small way, helped my brothers and sisters in Christ, enjoy the Eucharist. There is also the more mundane aspect of helping Fr. Frisby, the Acolytes, and keeping an eye on all of you to ensure we have no 911 calls! Thank you all for the warmth which you return to me.

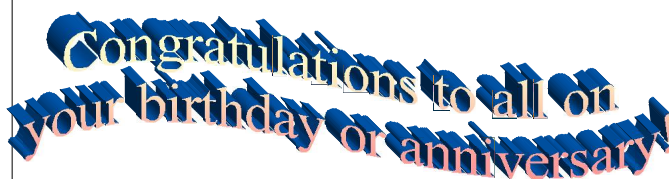

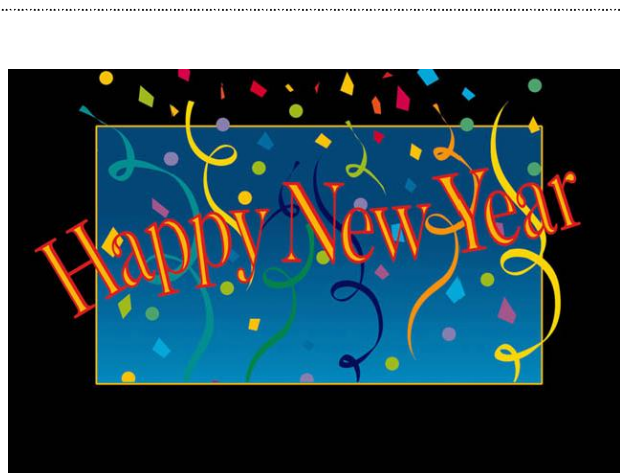
