It is a delight to become involved in the lives of the student recipients as they are interviewed, as we watch their faces light up on Awards Night in the High School auditoriums, and during the times they visit All Saints' Church and are introduced to the congregation on Sunday morning.


Graduation is a time of looking back and seeing one's accomplishments of the last twelve years. Sure, there have been some "missed moments", but there are also a lot of milestones which mark a young person's life leading up to Graduation.

In addition to the word "graduation", we hear the word "commencement" at Graduation Exercises. In other words, it is the beginning, a start in one's life, in addition to an ending. College, employment, or military service begins another chapter in the student's life. It's all brand new!

The same kind of beginnings and endings occur in Church life, particularly if one is an Anglican. The Sacrament of Confirmation is the moment when the Confirmand takes on his or her own Christian responsibilities, saying, "thanks" to the Godparent who had previously taken on those responsibilities. Sadly, sometimes it is seen as the completion of one's spiritual growth. We also see this expressed in one's baptism..."oh, now that she is baptized, we don't have to provide any spiritual resources until Confirmation."

Baptism, Confirmation, Reception are moments on one's spiritual journey, but they are NOT endings! We are enriched by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit during these moments, but we continue to grow in the Spirit.

As we enter the season of Pentecost, the Season of the Holy Spirit, I encourage you to re-view your spiritual life and see where a Commencement might occur.

Leduc awards \$12,500 in scholarships

On April 28th, the Leduc Fund of All Saints' awarded \$2,500 scholarships each to five deserving Jensen Beach High School students, for a total of \$12,500. There were 58 sponsors of scholarships, and according to chairman Bob Taylor's estimate, the amount of the All Saints' awards probably put it in the top five for scholarship funds given - resulting in a chorus of "ooh's" and "aah's" from the grateful audience of students and parents.

The five winners were selected from over ninety applicants reviewed by the Leduc committee of Bob Taylor, Tony Langran, Joyce Arthur, Marilyn Mawhinney, Wanda Beymer, Laurie Scrivani, and Father Frisby. Many hours were spent pouring over applications, narrowing the list of candidates, and finally conducting interviews of the finalists.

The winners were: Amanda Alker (Univ of Miami); Jordan Alves (FSU); Lisa Bresson (FAU); Kaileigh Kerstetter (UCF); and Zac Mahoney (FSU). They will be recognized at the 10 am service on May 15th.

Congratulations to these fine young people! As Tony Langran said at the rostrum, "Each year I become more confident in the future of this country when seeing these fine candidates". (Of course, after first noting that he gave up an invitation to attend a wedding at Westminster Abbey to be at Jensen Beach High School for the awards). Planned Giving Seminar

On Saturday, May 7, I attended a seminar given by Jim Murphy of the Episcopal Church Foundation (ECF) at St Mark's Episcopal church in Palm Beach Gardens. (I have prepared a more extensive report on this meeting for the Endowment Committee and the Vestry which I will be glad to share with anyone who is interested.)

The Episcopal Foundation is located in New York City and is an independent lay-led organization whose primary purpose is to strengthen the leadership and financial capabilities of Episcopal Congregations. They publish many resources to help Vestries in their work.

The focus of this seminar was planned giving, an area in which our Church has made great strides through the Endowment committee and the Heritage Society. In fact, I think we could serve as a model for other congregations in this area. Most of planned giving for the future of our Church (80%) comes from bequests provided for in people's wills. It is even recommended strongly through the Book of Common Prayer at the end of the Service for "A Thanksgiving for the Birth of a Child" on p.445, which surprised me. When we do this, we incorporate the Church into our family.

Bequests can be either unrestricted in their use or restricted. Unrestricted is generally preferred as it is sometimes hard to deal with restricted funds over time. The money should be soundly invested and only the interest used so the funds can grow over time. Its purpose needs to be carefully thought out and the funds have to be kept safe.

The Episcopal Foundation also has ways to help people give gifts that can be put into annuities or trusts and if anyone is interested in this, they can help you make an annuity that would help you have income when you are alive and then leave the remainder to the Church.

The ECF has a website with considerable information about estate planning and even about planning your own funeral. Hopefully, all of you have engaged in planning your estate, have wills and have considered a bequest to our Church.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

At their annual retreat last month, the Vestry and lay leaders of All Saints commissioned a long-range planning committee (LRPC) that will meet during the next several months. So far as anyone can remember, it has been quite some time since such a formal process of reflection and deliberation has been undertaken at this parish.

The purpose of the LRPC is to investigate and consider what is working well at All Saints, what isn't, what the church community might do to improve in various areas, and what strengths we might leverage to enhance our already robust and dynamic church community. Ultimately, the committee hopes to identify a series of goals and objectives that the entire church can embrace and support over the next several years.

The purpose of the LRPC is decidedly not to dictate choices and decisions. Rather, it is a facilitator of God's will, and of the hopes and dreams of the entire membership of All Saints. The committee will be completely transparent in its work, and will actively seek your input and feedback.

To that end, the LRPC is asking that you think about and answer the enclosed survey. You may return it to the Parish office, at a Sunday service, or to any member of the Vestry or the committee. We specifically do not want you to respond to these questions with each and every thought that comes to mind. Rather, we ask that you limit your responses to the three most important that you can think of after careful consideration. Please prioritize each response in the order of importance that you believe would most benefit All Saints and our church community.

The long-range planning committee will meet every other week throughout the year. At each Vestry meeting it will discuss its work to date, answering any questions you may have. Throughout this process the committee will seek the insight and feedback from All Saint's members. This will take the form of individual chats, small group discussions, and town hall style meetings of whoever wishes to join in the conversation.

Feel free to speak with members of the LRPC any time you like. The committee is small by design, utilizing the talents of its members who have had previous experience in facilitating long-range planning projects of this kind. The members of the committee, and their contact information, are listed on the following page.
