Preparing for a New Program Year

Beloved in Christ,

Imagine giving up twelve hours a week to work in the church office. Think about sitting every Thursday morning at 8:00 a.m. at a long conference table, folding and stuffing bulletins and newsletters. Visualize entering a hospital room, where a stranger is lying in bed, waiting for a prayer. That is what the folk on the front cover do week after week. Not one of those individuals, photographed on the front cover, receive compensation...except for me.


In addition to their time, these individuals give the Church their energy. In our Long Range Planning survey, one of the most repeated requests is "please increase communication". At our recent staff retreat, where the photograph was taken, our facilitator, Mike McCoy, led staff members in a discussion, "How can the staff and administration communicate more effectively with the parish?" These forms of communication, which the survey and the retreat encouraged, are found beyond the bulletin, Trumpet, web site, telephone, e-mail and cell phones. We need to do as much "face-to-face" communication as possible. It's hard work to communicate with folk!

The presence of our Seminary Graduate, "Dr. Pierre", is a perfect illustration to underscore the importance of communication on a one-to-one basis. To become more comfortable with English, "Pastor Pierre" takes advantage of books, recordings, and teachers. However, the most effective way for him to learn the skills of communication is to speak to parishioners.

When I enter Houg Hall for Coffee Hour, my eyes scan the Parish Hall to see if there is someone standing alone. If I find someone who is not conversing, I intentionally approach them. However, the majority of the time, folk are deep in conversation. Most are interacting with others. It must be easy to communicate during Coffee Hour. The challenge is communicating when it isn't easy.

The other day, I was breaking bread with the new Rector of our neighbor church, St. Mary's, Stuart. We were talking about how easy it is to stereotype. Words like "large" and "contemporary" are applied to St. Mary's. Words like "small and intimate" and "high church" are associated with All Saints'. Words can be helpful in communication, but they can also become barriers. When we attempt to communicate with others, remind one another that it is not helpful to have assumptions about "the other". Let them define themselves, instead of defining them.

As we enter the new program year of 2011-2012, we all recognize the importance of communication. May we ask the Holy Spirit to direct us in as we exchange words with one another.

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

This month the All Saints' Staff would like to examine with you the need and use of the Financial Request Form and the Reimbursement Request Form.

The Financial Request Form is used when an organization or ministry needs the church to assume the responsibility of direct payment to an individual or vendor for supplies or services rendered.

The Financial Request Form should be filled out completely and as much in advance as possible, preferably ten (10) days so that the Finance Committee can plan for the expense. The Finance Committee will review the request and return it in a timely manner. Please note if the request is denied for some reason, an explanation is provided.

The Request for Reimbursement Form is used when an individual has paid for previously authorized services or supplies rendered to or for the church out of their personal account. The form must be completed in detail with an original or copy of an original receipt attached.

All of the forms can be found in folders on the administrator's door in the office. The staff will also provide copies of any of these forms upon request to any organization, ministry or individual.

It is our hope that this series of articles on administration and procedures proves to be helpful to all.

Next month we shall explore additional forms and procedures.

Seminarian-in-Residence at All Saints Church - Pierre Simpson Gabaud

I am currently a postulant for Holy Order from the Diocese of Southeast Florida. After my graduation on May 13, 2011 from the School of Theology at Sewanee, Tennessee, I came to All Saints in Jensen Beach with my family at the end of May to continue with my ordination process and to practice my theological formation in my Diocese, Southeast Florida.

I grew up in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. I am the 6th of 10 children in a devout Episcopal family. I started with sociology studies and ended up with theology formation. My top strengths include responsibility, connectedness, analytical thinking, and discipline. My gifts center around evangelism, teaching, and leadership, proclamation of faith, helping and serving. With my theological training, I became more sensitive, and less analytical than in the past.

I hold a Ph. D. in sociology from the University of Laval in Canada. I was a professor of sociology for 18 years at Haitian State University, University Quisqueya, and was a Senior Research Associate at University of Miami and professor at Miami Dade College. I have published three sociology books.

My move to change careers from sociology to ordained ministry occurred when I started serving as Sub-deacon at my home parish, the Church of the Resurrection in Miami around 2004. Since then, my meetings with the diocesan leadership, Bishop Leo Frade, Bishop James Otley, Archdeacon Bryan Hobbs, Archdeacon Mary Gray Reeves (Currently Bishop) brought me plenty of moral and spiritual support in this transitory time. Nevertheless, the development of my vocation spans a lifetime from my childhood to the present.

Today, I am currently a Seminarian-in-Residence at All Saints' Church in Jensen Beach, assisting Father Frisby for 3-4 months. Father Frisby suggested that parishioners call me Pastor Pierre as I am not ordained yet, nor am I a seminarian anymore nor a graduate seminarian. Father Frisby, Rector of all Saints, the Vestry members, and other committees of the Church, indeed, all of the parishioners are very nice to me and want to accompany me in my process.

Under the Rev. Father Frisby's leadership, not only am I participating in all liturgical activities, but also I am planning other activities like "A Senior Citizens Get together," "A Holy Land experience," "A potluck meeting focusing on youth activities (outreach for a youth program)," and "A concert." All of these activities will combine leisure and Christian Education. My Master's Degree in Divinity gives me enough knowledge to be a good priest and pastor, and also a religious thinker. I am really interested in knowing more about faith, spirituality, and worship which I plan to write about more in the future. In these researches, I would like to discover the "dialectical Correlation" among these topics in the Christian Church functioning. I will ask some friends and colleagues-professors, including the Rev. Father Frisby, professor of Liturgy, to look over my research.

Seminarian-in-Residence at All Saints Church (continued)

I have a deep spiritual desire to spread and fulfill God's work. I have shown strong leadership ability and the means to learn and gain more. I am a listener, a good manager who is able to make others feel at ease. I always fulfill my responsibilities. I love research, reading, movies, and intellectual group discussion. I am a lifelong learner and planner.

I enjoy preaching, gathering with people, planning, working with people, and coordinating activities. I feel comfortable at All Saints' Church to administer the sacraments every Sunday at 8 and 10: 00 am, and attend the healing services every Wednesday, to be at the Office Monday through Wednesday, and sometimes on Thursdays either for English immersion or for administrative practice, where I benefit from Father Frisby's experience and teaching.

I would like my ministry, wherever I am, to be based on Jesus' life, Jesus' teaching, worship of God, entertainment, and fellowship, a world of joy, peace, and hope, made for all God's people. I see myself as a parish priest who is able to share knowledge, experiences, and spiritual life with my parishioners.

Finally, I would like to thank All Saints' Church members for their warm welcome. I hope my short time here, as a Seminarian-in-Residence, will be a great experience for me and for them too. May the peace of God always be with them.

Diaconate Candidate Report

As many of you may know, I am now completing the next step in my process of becoming a Deacon and it doesn't get any easier. I have completed the most recent packet of information to be sent to the Diocese to apply for postulancy. It includes a police check, sending transcripts of my college grades, a 5 hour psychological evaluation, a complete physical examination and both another biographical statement and a statement of my church background to include information on how I see my mission as a Deacon, both of which are to be 3 typewritten pages. All of this is necessary to be submitted before I go before the Commission on Ministry which hopefully will occur on Friday September 16th, so continue to keep me in your prayers as I continue in this process.

I have just registered again for classes for the second year at the Diocesan School which starts on September 10th and, like last year, I will have 4 classes and will attend eight alternate Saturdays in the Fall at St Mark's in Oakland Park. I will share more with you next month about the classes.

I am continuing my work as Coordinator of Pastoral Care and hope you will keep me informed of those in need of these services. Just to mention one person I am in contact with, Marge James. Marge is now in rehab in Boston, Mass. and expects to be there for another 6 weeks. What happens after that seems uncertain. I know she hopes to return here.

I call her about once a week to see how she is doing. I'm sure she would love to hear from other members of our parish as well. The primary focus now is the healing of her fractured shoulder.

As many of you know, I am now Coordinating the TRUE fund, which has been set up to give small amounts of emergency financial assistance to parishioners and members of our community who are in financial crisis. I have already given assistance to two people in the past two weeks and have a couple of additional applications pending so, I know the need is great, as you can imagine, in these difficult economic times. If you feel so inclined, additional contributions could be used, if you are able to give. Just put it in your weekly envelope and designate that it is for TRUE.

I am also spending time each week with Dr. Pierre to help him with the task of improving his speaking and comprehension of English. I enjoy this very much and he is a wonderful person to work with and, as with all teachers, I am probably learning as much about French and Haiti as he learns from me about English.

Long Range Planning Committee

August 10, 2011

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In May the Long-Range Planning Committee (LRPC) included a survey in *The Trumpet* that asked the members of All Saints to comment on the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats to our church. We initially asked to receive the surveys within the next two weeks, but extended that timeframe considerably due to a lackluster response. In the end, from a membership that exceeds 300, we received a total of 13 responses.

Because of the limited response it is difficult to conclude with any certainty that the themes that emerged from the various responses are representative of the feelings shared by the entirety of All Saints' congregation. It is possible that many members are satisfied with their relationship with All Saints and therefore did not feel the need to comment. It is also possible that many did not, or could not, respond simply due to the timing of the survey after many of our members returned north.

Regardless of the reasons for the low response rate, several important themes did emerge. The congregation feels strengthened by their many friends in the church, by the warm and loving atmosphere within the parish, and by the enthusiasm, sense of humor, and spirituality of Father Frisby.

Several thought that the communication throughout the church could be improved, as could the church's administration. Opportunities that were suggested for All Saints to pursue included adult and youth Christian education, greater outreach, and a larger and evolving lay leadership pool. Lastly, the most significant threat to All Saints, mentioned by several of those who responded, is the divisive effect of damaging church politics. A full report that discusses the survey in detail is available from the church office to anyone who may wish to read it.

Now we turn our attention to the second and final survey of this series. It asks you to indicate your level of agreement or disagreement with several statements that fall under various categories of concern as identified in the first survey and from the LRPC. The major headings in this survey are: Outreach, Christian education, Church finances, and Communications. You may return it to the Parish office, at a Sunday service, or to any member of the Vestry or the committee.

Your participation in this survey is vital as we evaluate the current state of our church and prepare for its future. The LRPC is making every effort to solicit the input of the entire membership and to make these deliberations as transparent as possible. Our objective is to lay a solid foundation to ensure not only the long-term sustainability of All Saints, but one that will allow it to thrive as well.

While we have left room for your individual comments, it is important that you respond to each statement so that we can properly score them and analyze them in the aggregate. If the response rate is low, so will be our confidence in the results.

One issue that appeared to cause some confusion in the first survey was the exact nature of the church's administrative structure. Several years ago we moved from a pastoral-size parish church to a program-size church. That was a reflection of our increasing membership and our improved ability to manage our own affairs. It also meant that the administration of All Saints became the direct responsibility of the Vestry and our many lay leaders, with the help and advice of our Rector, who is responsible for our spiritual guidance.

The Long-Range Planning Committee was created following the Vestry and lay leaders retreat in April, when it was determined that a more critical evaluation of All Saints was needed in order to carefully plan for a future of increased vitality, fellowship, and spiritual outreach. Your participation in these surveys is hugely important to this process of reflection and discernment, and we thank you for your involvement.

All Saint's Episcopal Church Vestry Resolution on Stewardship - 2012

WHEREAS, Giving ten percent of one's time, talent and treasure to God is the norm for Christians and

WHEREAS, Holy Scripture refers to "the tithe" more than 30 times, and

WHEREAS, the Episcopal Church has stated in General Convention that the tithe is the minimum standard of giving.
